

Packing list for Outdoor Education camps:

Groups will be engaged in outside activity all day, so bring appropriate clothing.

- We will walk on rocky trails, so wear **good sturdy shoes**.
- Clothes for outdoor activity.
- Rain gear if the forecast is rainy
- **Creek Shoes** or sandals for wading if doing a water lab (flip-flops won't work here, shoes need to stay on your feet!)
- **Water Bottle** for hikes
- Bedding for twin and double mattresses or a sleeping bag
- Towels & Toiletries
- Flashlight
- **Pen, notebook, Bible**
- **Sun Screen** & insect repellent
- **Smiles**
- Cash for canteen: snacks, sodas, t-shirts (\$12-14), etc.



Optional:

- Binoculars are useful on habitat hikes
- Camera / camcorder
- Fishing pole & tackle
- Water nets or other tools useful during creation labs

Other helpful info:

Wal-mart in Siloam Springs is a 15 minute drive.



Camp Safety and Emergencies:

- Group will be responsible for providing at least 1 counselor for every 10 kids in a cabin.
- All camp programs include activities that have some risk. We plan our program to be as safe as possible.
- We answer incoming phone calls and check messages regularly 24 hours a day during camp sessions. Intercom telephones are in every building; we'll get messages to you.
- Group leaders or parents are responsible for administering first aid and making medical decisions regarding themselves and their students. In an emergency, physicians and a hospital are 15 minutes away in Siloam Springs, Arkansas.

Accommodations:

Our cabins and dorms have one double and up to 5 single beds per room. All rooms contain central heat & air and indoor bathrooms. **Campers are responsible for bedding and towels.** Our "all you can eat" meals are prepared fresh each day by our loving staff.
